Monitoring and appropriate supportive and symptomatic treatment is the only option which can be offered to these group of patients.

Some of the tropical Virus carries the risk of human-to-human transmission and we as medical personnel needs to be aware about these viral diseases to safeguard ourselves and other paramedical staff. We will be focusing on these issues of transmission prevention.
